## CANCER INSTITUTE HONORS NANTUCKET RESIDENTS

Nantucket residents, George Cloutier and Tiffany Spadafora, will host the 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Mardi-Gras themed Boogie on Low Beach fundraiser to celebrate the lives and efforts of four islanders who are true heroes in the fight against cancer. This year's honorees have either survived cancer, are currently battling the disease or are part of a support system for those afflicted with cancer. Cloutier and Spadafora are proud to announce the honorees:

- Charlene Chadwick, an oncology nurse, has worked at Nantucket Cottage Hospital since 1986 and started the hospital's chemotherapy program in 1991. Married to Brian and a mother of two, Charlene was recently inducted into Sigma Theta Tau International – the honor society of nursing.
- Mark Heartfield, the Head Golf Professional at Siasconset's Sankaty Head Golf Club for 19 summer seasons, was diagnosed with facial melanoma in December 2005. He underwent treatment at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute and is currently winning his quest to be melanoma-free. He and his wife Marybeth have two daughters.
- Irma Anapol has summered on Nantucket with her husband Joel and their family since 1959. After surviving three occasions of recurring breast cancer with experimental medical procedures, she made it her calling to counsel and educate. In Washington D.C., she informed the Food and Drug Administration and the National Resources Defense Council of changes necessary to protect against harmful pesticides.
- Carl Jelleme is the owner and founder of Toscana Corp on Nantucket. Eleven years ago Carl was first diagnosed with melanoma. After undergoing a vaccine trial and aggressive alternative treatments, Carl is cancer-free today. He is married to Barbara and has two children.

In addition to honoring these four individuals, proceeds from the event will help support cancer care and research at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. Cloutier is a member of Dana-Farber Cancer Institute's Board of Trustees and the creator and underwriter of Boogie on Low Beach.

This year's event will be held on Friday, July 21, 6:15 p.m. to midnight at Cloutier and Spadafora's home at 40 Low Beach Road, 'Sconset. ■
